#### **Important Information**

**Student Planners** - All students are issued a planner where they keep all assignments. Parents can also communicate with teachers utilizing the planner.

Parent/Student Handbook - All parents have access to the handbook on-line. The handbook contains specific and pertinent information to guide parents through the culture and expectations of both Bennet Academy and the district. After you read the handbook, please sign off electronically on the *Informational Reading Verification Form*.

**S.T.A.R.S. Packet** - All students receive this packet that contains information outlining the behavioral expectations of students at Bennet.

Bus Transportation - Students must take their assigned bus home and only children assigned to a bus are allowed on bus transportation. The bus driver is in charge of students while on the bus and students are expected to follow the driver's instructions at all times, including wearing masks. Picking up Your Student Early - If you must pick up your child before dismissal please call the school (860-647-3571) and we will call your child to the office. When you arrive at the school please ring the bell at the Franklin Main Building and we will bring your child to the

door and check your ID. Please be prepared to wait outside for your child as we try to limit the number of visitors to the building. We appreciate your patience. Please make every effort to schedule appointments outside of school hours so your child is not missing class on a regular basis.

Breakfast Program - Breakfast is served in a grab and go style in the morning when your child enters the building. They will eat at their desk, which is outfitted with a plexiglass barrier. Breakfast has no charge this year.

Lunches - Lunch will be served in classrooms as we did last year.

Desk shields will be utilized. Approximately every 3 weeks classes will take a week-long "turn" eating lunch in the cafeteria (using their shields). A choice of two lunch options will be available this year, a bagel plate or a hot lunch option. There is no charge for lunch this year. **Lockers/Locks** - For the 2021-2022 school year we are going back to using lockers. Students will keep their belongings in their locker and locks will be provided.

**Parking** - Parents should park in the designated Visitor Parking areas around the school. There are a limited number of visitor parking spots available in the front of Bennet Academy.

**Safety and Security** - Bennet Academy is protected by locked fencing, locked doors and buildings are connected by glass walk-ways.

Afterschool Clubs and Activities - There typically is a myriad of after school programming at Bennet Academy, including intramural sports, Peer Leadership Councils, music groups, drama, and so much more. Manchester Parks and Recreation Department and Bennet Academy clubs and activities tend to begin operation in October of each year and we will keep you updated as to the start date for new programs. At that time we will also offer a late bus two days a week.

Positive Programming - Important to the social and emotional development of our students is the sense of accomplishment and even "reward" for "doing the right thing" and "stepping up to the plate". At Bennet Academy it is important for us to recognize students for showing leadership qualities and STARS behavior whenever possible. We utilize many different opportunities for positive reinforcement, including Student Spotlight, Student of the Month breakfast, Character Award, and STARS Award to name a few.
